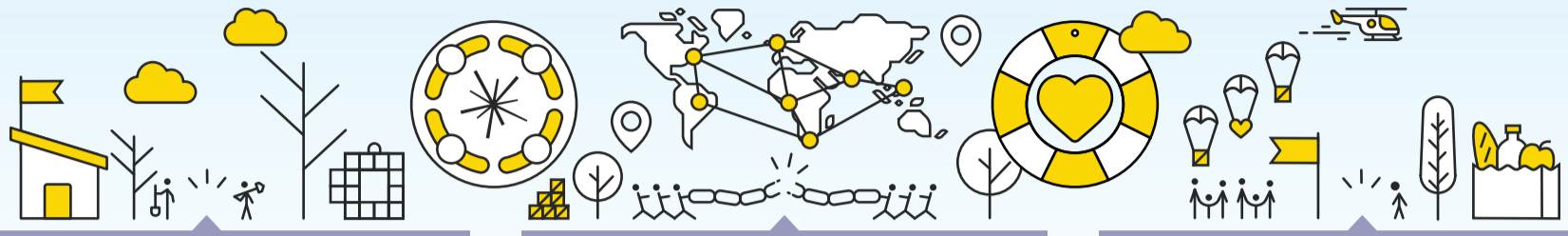

More effective anti-trafficking interventions and movement

- Heightened awareness and understanding of trafficking risks and realities
- Frontline voices included in international aid and policy fora
- Stronger enforcement of anti-trafficking legislation
- Increased funding opportunities for frontline work
- Better support for survivors
- Policy and regulatory reform

Increased resilience to human trafficking in focus communities

- Increased community solidarity and self-reliance
- Reduced poverty
- Increased knowledge and exercise of rights
- Reduced unsafe migration
- Increased attendance in formal education
- Increased employment and financial security
- Reduced risk of re-trafficking

Increased frontline capacity to respond to need and prevent human trafficking
